RCBC River Run - Kingston-on-Murray to Renmark 1- 9 May 2024

This extended cruise takes in many of our picturesque Riverland towns and some beautiful stretches of the Murray River National Park. It is suitable for anything from open boats equipped for camping to cruisers and houseboats. We will have the luxury of catered meals (optional) at five of our stops. Adding to the soft life, will have the amenities trailer at three of our camps and full caravan park facilities at our final stop in Renmark. Otherwise there will be bush camping and campfire cooking at Raines Bend, Whirlpool Bend and Lyrup Flats. Our layover day will be at Whirlpool Bend, where there will be many opportunities for canoeing, kayaking and mucking about in tinnies. Each day is a short run, so there will be plenty of time for relaxing, exercise and exploring the towns, as you please. As usual, we will have some games, competitions and opportunities to perform (in more ways than one). We have also booked in to the Loxton Historical Village for an extended visit.

This River Run covers a total distance of approximately 130km, but some may wish to do it as an out-and-back return trip. Car parking at both ends and driver shuffles have been organized, but must be booked. Replenishment of fuel, food and drinks will be possible along the route, with car-based support in some locations.

Our designated charity for this event is the Moorook Kingston-on-Murray Community Association (MKOMCA) for their work in flood recovery. MKOMCA have provided volunteer labour and materials to rehabilitate gardens of recently widowed local women and they are also rehabilitating 18km of riverside trails built by this group prior to the 2022-3 flood.

Fruit fly restrictions apply within South Australia and as at time of publication, within the Riverland. More information on this is available on-line and links to this are presented on page 6.

Your registration fee **includes**: 2024 River Runners' bag containing - burgee, information booklet, name badge, printed maps and brochures where available; use of RCBC facilities including Amenities trailer and consumables (e.g. gas, water, soap and detergents, hand sanitizer, paper products, first aid supplies (if required); catered BBQ at K-o-M Hall (1 May); *general camping and mooring fees at Lyrup Flats and Renmark Riverbend Caravan Park; car and trailer transfers facilitated by volunteer drivers. **Exclusions**: catered meal at Moorook Bowling Club, takeaway, food van, restaurant or hotel meals at Loxton, Berri and Renmark. *We have booked 5 riverfront camping/caravan sites at the Renmark Riverbend Caravan Park and these are available on a first-registered-first-served basis. Other sites in the park may be booked separately at your own cost. Five waterfront/pet friendly cabins have also been included in our booking and these have been paid for in advance by the persons requesting cabins. These bookings have been made to ensure that we have sufficient riverbank for exclusive mooring of our fleet. All other booking in caravan parks and camping grounds are at your own cost. The RCBC carries limited insurance for our activities and this does not cover insurance for your car, trailer or boat.

Raffle/Prizes for our designated charity - The Moorook Kingston-on-Murray Community Assoc.

The RCBC has a long history of donating to charities relevant to the Riverland, young people, boaties and/or boating. Traditionally this has been done mostly through a major (and labour-intensive) auction associated with the River Run. This is beyond the resources of our Club these days, but we endeavour to keep up the philanthropic tradition by raising money through raffles and games held during events. These are a fun part of our activities. If you can, please bring a prize for a raffle or mini-auction. Raffle prizes should be valued at no more than \$50 and can be mystery prizes (wrapped) or displayed to demonstrate their true worth. Prizes can be new, recycled or re-purposed, humorous or serious, but should not be too big because you will need to carry your donation on your boat and so will the winners. Our sponsors and commercial friends will also make contributions. Please also bring some spare cash so that you can participate in the nightly raffle draws and IOUs will be accepted if we have a mini-auction or two. Movement of fruit and vegetable restrictions - INTO the Riverland from other parts of South Australia https://fruitfly.sa.gov.au/outbreak-restrictions/fruit-and-vegetables-at-risk

The current estimate for the end date for restrictions **WITHIN** the Riverland outbreak areas is 24 April 2024 (i.e. before the River Run, but end-dates have been extended previously - it only takes one fly).

As at the time of dispatch of this Registration Form (14 February 2024), Kingston-on-Murray, Moorook and parts of Loxton and Waikerie, are outside of the Red restricted zones, but in the Yellow zones. However the store in K-o-M is now closed and the Moorook store does not stock fruit and veg. Transfer of fruit and veg. from Yellow areas to any other Yellow or Red area is permitted if purchased at a shop (permanent retail business), with an itemised receipt. You must seal fruit and vegetables in a bag or container while moving them. Stores at Walker Flat, Swan Reach and Blanchetown had endeavoured to expand their range and specific stores in Murray Bridge and Mannum were accredited for movement of fruit into the Riverland. Berri and Renmark are inside the restricted Red zones.
